Introduction

Every three years, [Healthy Sheboygan County](#), a community-based initiative seeking to make positive changes in the health status of Sheboygan County residents, partners with local hospital systems and non-governmental organizations to assess the community's health needs and create a recommended set of health-related topics to prioritize over the next few years. This report is one of several summaries that illustrates the information gathered during the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) process. The purpose of this Secondary Data Report is to consolidate secondary source information with the aim of creating a profile of the health status of Sheboygan County residents; primary indicators were not included and state and national comparisons were provided when available.

The information contained within this report comes from publicly available data sources including: the US Census Bureau's American Community Survey and 2010/2020 Decennial Census, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services' Wisconsin Interactive Health Statistics (WISH) query system, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services' Office of Health Informatics, the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families, the Wisconsin Department of Justice, the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute's County Health Rankings, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases (NCIRD), Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), the CDC's PLACES project, the Environmental Protection Agency (EJScreen tool), the National Vital Statistics System-Mortality (NVSS-M), the National Cancer Institute (NCI), the Wisconsin Health Association Information Center (WHAIC), and the US Diabetes Surveillance System. Tables were mainly compiled from a single source, however some tables contain information aggregated from several sources.

Data for each indicator were presented by race/ethnicity, gender, and various age groupings when available. Race data categorized as 'unknown' or 'missing' were rarely included in this report. Therefore, not all races are represented in the data that follow due to how information was presented from the source. Some tables present race data *'alone or in combination'*, which includes people who reported a single race alone (e.g., Asian) and people who reported that race in combination with one or more of the other major race groups (e.g., White, Black or African American, American Indian and Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and Some Other Race). The 'race alone or in combination' concept, therefore, represents the maximum number of people who reported as that race group, either alone, or in combination with another race(s). The sum of the six individual race 'alone or in combination' categories may add to more than the total population because people who reported more than one race were tallied in each race category.

In some cases data were not presented by the system from which they were obtained due to their internal confidentiality policies which specify that data will not be released when the number is less than five. In other cases, data were available but the rates or percentages are not presented in this report. This is due to the indicator having small numbers in the numerator or denominator resulting in rates or percentages that, in combination with other reported information, result in the display of a cell containing a value of 1 to 4.99, which conflicts with the reporting of a number less than five. These instances are denoted with grayed out cells. Cells with "N/A" represent data in which zero cases were reported. When available, state and national comparisons were provided.
